members.

Communication

A Press Release about the purpose and location of the meeting was posted on the Michigan Department of Transportation website and appeared in The Canton Connection / Observer and Eccentric Newspapers and Hometown Weeklies / Hometown Life.com on Monday, May 24, 2012 and is included at the back of this summary.

A postcard with information about the purpose and location of the meeting was mailed to all businesses within the project study area and is included at the back of this summary.

Public Hearing Format

The Public Information Meeting was conducted using an open-house format. The meeting took place continuously from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. with team members gathered to field questions and guide visitors through exhibits.

Upon arrival, attendees were asked to sign the meeting register, given a project fact sheet and general comment form (attached) to fill out stating their name and contact information. Attendees were



encouraged to fill out and submit the comment forms and/or speak to a Study Team member concerning any questions they had about the project.

The public was given the opportunity to learn about the project through large exhibit boards and a traffic video. The displayed exhibits and video stills can be found at the back of this summary.

A PowerPoint presentation (attached) was also utilized to present project information and was presented on a loop in order for the public to view the presentation at their leisure.

Comment Sheets

Comment sheets and written comments received at the Public Information Meeting are summarized below and included at the back of this summary.

Attendees were asked "What do you desire to see with the traffic in the study area?" Written comments overwhelming supported efforts to reduce the congestion on Ford Road to make traffic flow "efficiently and safely."

A number of comments received expressed desire for:

- The proper timing of all traffic signals (14)
- Proper amount of signage on all study area roads (2)
- No left turns out of businesses onto Ford Road (10)
- Another way to get on/off I-275; suggestions included: (30)
 - o Entrance/exits to Warren and Cherry Hill (13)
 - o Off ramp from I-275 to Haggerty (4)
 - Add southbound exit off I-275 on existing Ford Rd and feed traffic west to Haggerty over the IKEA overflow parking area (3)
 - o An exit on Sheldon from I-275 (1)
 - Close ramps at Ford to make traffic go to Michigan Ave. (1)
 - o Warren Rd. ramp to give easier access to Westland Mall (2)
- A way to get big trucks an easy access to Haggerty without getting on Ford Rd. (3)
 - o Add an entrance/exit at Koppernick or Warren (2)
- Remove all access to businesses along Ford Road and build a service drive for access (2)
- Add additional travel and or turn lanes to Ford Road (8)
- Add an access road/service drive behind businesses along Ford Road (8)
 - o Provide parking connectivity between Haggerty and Lilly for the businesses (2)
- Improvements to other roads in the area to divert traffic from Ford Road; suggestions included:
 - Pave Ridge and Napier Roads to allow people easier access to M-14 to avoid Beck Rd. (1)
 - o Pave Lotz from Cherry Hill to Ford (5)
 - o Pave Lotz to eliminate truck traffic (1)
 - o Widen Cherry Hill (5)
 - o Expand Cherry Hill from Newburgh to Beck (2)
 - o Widen Warren, make Warren five lanes (4)
 - o Make Haggerty five lanes (2)
 - o Expand Haggerty from Ann Arbor Rd. to Ford Rd. (1)
 - o Better traffic flow on Warren, Cherry Hill, Lotz, Haggerty, Lilly, Sheldon (2)
 - o Exit at Warren for trucks or at Joy by the airport (1)

- Add eastbound lane at Wendy's access by Haggerty and I-275 with additional signage (1)
- An over-the-road road to get from Haggerty to Meijer area (1)
- No stopping and over-the-road from Haggerty to Hix or Newburgh (1)
- Add a fly-over bridge to carry traffic from westbound Ford to southbound Haggerty (1)
- Add a pedestrian crossing from IKEA overflow parking lot to IKEA main parking lot (1)
- Direct parking lot traffic to existing signals (2)
- A reduction in speed limit from 45 to 35 mph (1)
- More enforcement of traffic laws (2)
- Construct a boulevard on Ford Road from the City of Westland to Canton Center Road (3)
- Eliminate "Good Samaritan" left turns at non-signalized drives (1)
- No roundabouts (3)
- Stop no right turns on red (1)
- Public Transportation from Ypsilanti to Ann Arbor down Ford Rd. (1)
- Eliminate shoppers concerns about Ford Road being too congested and dangerous (1)

Additional written comments received:

- Widening Cherry Hill Rd will affect our home values (1)
- Cherry Hill should be an interchange for homeowners in the area. Warren could also be considered. Homeowners currently go around Ford Rd. (1)
- I would like to see Cherry Hill Road developing as Canton downtown area as opposed to Meijer Road (1)
- Resolve the traffic issues on Ford Road before widening Cherry Hill (1)
- I would like to see MDOT support local Moms and Pops shops on Cherry Hill (1)
- There should be a plan to take care of Lotz before any construction around to minimize problems for residents to enter and leave properties (1)
- Red curbs = no cell phone use (1)
- I strongly believe that modifications to Ford Road first before impacting residential area decreasing property values. Increased noise, more garbage along new busy road (Warren or Palmer) (2)
- Two additional traffic lanes in each direction of Ford Road between I-275 and Beck Road. (2)
- Please do a good job overhauling the flow of traffic in this area. It's horrendous. No one living in Canton drives on Ford Rd. during rush hours/weekends unless they have to (1)
- Overhaul of 275/ M-153/ Haggerty area. This is a complete nightmare (1)
- Living around here is a nightmare! We can't see our houses because they are underwater- can we at least get somewhere in Canton in less than 30 minutes note even at rush hour?? (1)
- Too many cars making right turns onto Haggerty causing traffic to back up on the ramps even going onto I-275 causing a dangerous situation (1)
- Pedestrian/bicycle traffic is impossible at the I-275/Ford Rd. area. Traveling under I-275 via
 Ford Rd. is hazardous. Crossing north / south across Ford Rd. is very dangerous for those who
 wish to use/commute via the I-275 path. A solution to encourage and facilitate
 pedestrian/bicycle ease of access and travel must be addressed (1)
- Pedestrians and bicyclists must be provided with safe means of traversing this intersection. The study should investigate infrastructure improvements, lane striping, auto traffic control signage, and any means that will increase safety and ease of access for those who do not use an internal combustion vehicle (1)
- Relieve congestion on Ford Road to minimize drivers using Saltz Road speeding traffic endangers residents and school children (1)

- 1. There needs to be another entrance/exit to I-275 at either Warren Road or Cherry Hill Road - or both. There is no way that one entrance/exit to I-275 at M-153 can handle all the traffic. I live a long way from the current entrance, yet I am forced to use the Ford Road ramps to enter/exit I -275. I would gladly use a Warren or Cherry Hill ramp to access the I-275 rather than head down Ford Road. The left turn signal that was added at eastbound Cherry Hill onto northbound Haggarty has helped me avoid most of Ford Road, but I still must turn from Haggarty onto Ford to enter I-275.
- 2. You can add a cloverleaf exit from southbound I-275 to eastbound M-153. That will reduce the traffic on the current southbound exit.
- 3. Eastbound Ford Road at Haggarty has a right turn lane onto southbound Haggarty. This lane should be expanded to allow traffic turning southbound onto I-275 to use that right turn lane, i.e. traffic could then go straight through the Haggarty intersection, and then turn south on I-275. The right turn storage lane should be expaned westward 1/4 mile from the intersection to allow for vehicle storage during the red light. Currently people merge into the right lane after passing through the haggarty intersection, in the spaces left by the people turning southbound onto I-275. This is a mess that should be cleanned up.

Hurry up and implement the changes. I've been waiting years for this to occur. There should be other ways to get into Canton than using Ford Road.





Gentlemen:

Thank you for giving us the opportunity for public comment regarding the above. We have a major concern regarding expansion plans for the above project, specifically *expanding Cherry Hill Road to five-lanes from Haggerty east to Newburgh Road, as described on page 7; and access to Northbound I-275 from Cherry Hill Road, without the use of Haggerty Road, bypassing Ford/Haggerty intersection, as described on page 5, we are opposed to both of these recommendations.*

In June of 2010, we purchased and moved into the Cherry Hill Pointe Condominium Subdivision and unaware of any proposal to expand Cherry Hill Road. During the summer, the view of Cherry Hill Road is hidden by a small area of trees and bushes *however, the traffic noise is not*. With the expansion of Cherry Hill Road to five lanes, we would lose our small area of trees and bushes, and would inherit an increase in traffic noise.

In today's Detroit News (Friday June 22nd) Canton's Township Supervisor LaJoy stated *a solution has been long overdue.* We don't care what the solution is, we just want it fixed. As long as they help reduce the traffic flow of Ford Road. With that in mind, it is also noted on page 13 of Tiger Grant 2012 Discretionary Grant Application, key corridors in Canton for economic growth on Lotz Road, just east of 1-275 and Cherry Hill Road and Ford Road. We have concerns about residential and commercial development in this area creating more traffic congestion before the Ford Road issue is resolved.

As Community leaders have an obligation to its residents to improve local roads and services, expanding Cherry Hill Road between Haggerty and Newburgh will not resolve the congestion on Ford Road for local businesses and Canton residents. Cherry Hill Road has handled in the past heavier traffic flow from road repairs and/or road closures on Ford Road and Warren Road, as it is currently being used with the closure of Warren Road.

Besides the Ecorse and Michigan Road exits, have you considered adding an exit and/or service drive from I-275 onto Van Born that would extend to Haggerty and Lilley roads going Northbound, as well as an exit and/or service drive between Joy Road and Warren. This would help residents reach their homes in both the south and north side of Ford Road, as well as businesses owners and employees.

Good Morning,

Upon personal experience living in Western Wayne County and strong persuasion from the Canton Township Government, I am writing to you today regarding possible solutions I really hope to see implemented along one of Michigan's most accident prone corridors: Ford Road. The following are changes I would **really** like to see happening:

- 1. Ford Road constructed into a boulevard from west of Canton Center Road intersection to the City of Westland border: I have talked to numerous local officials over the years who agree that such a plan is possible, but must be constructed allowing only two lanes in each direction to be built. Some online publications concerning boulevard roads also agree that the narrower the median of a boulevard is, the more safer it is for motorists as well. I also contacted an MDOT official regarding the matter and was later told that the road can be done if it replicates that has been done on Sashabaw Road in Oakland County and that some business may need to lose a couple of parking spaces to secure enough right of way. Not only would a boulevard allow safer turns into the many businesses along Ford Road, but a boulevard would also aesthetically enhance our community. Many communities such as the city of Troy already have a boulevard (Big Beaver Road) in place in their communities allowing easier flow of traffic. I believe that Canton also deserves this type of roadway as well. Finally, although recent debates have placed much emphasis on the Ford/I-275 interchange, after driving through the area, one will notice that the problems are occurring all along Ford Road.
- 2. Lotz Road paved into a five lane road with a median lane from Ford to Cherry Hill Roads. Paving Lotz Road will allow for more development in the community along Lotz Road and would also give motorists an option to head east on Ford Road and turn into Lotz Road, thus easing congestion along Road Road.
- 3. A new interchange on I-275 at either Warren or Cherry Hill Road would allow a separation of residential traffic and business traffic into the area.
- 4. Consolidating the many business driveways along Ford Road into a few big ones and then installing traffic lights and creating new intersections at these points will ease some of the accident potential along Ford Road.
- 5. Making slips ramps on the Ford/I-275 Interchange to allow traffic to move directly onto Haggerty Road as discussed on the Canton Township Website.

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MDOT widens traffic study beyond **Ford Road**

Pursuing what many motorists consider a long-overdue solution to Canton's traffic woes, the Michigan Department of Transportation has begun a new study that reaches beyond car-clogged Ford Road.

The study is expected to hatch a set of preliminary proposals as early as August before closing in on a solution by January, Gorette Yung, MDOT project and contract administration engineer, said Thursday.

The effort is expected to lead to a phasedin solution to local traffic woes, Yung said, regardless of whether Canton and MDOT succeed at securing \$18 million or more through a fourth-round federal program dubbed TIGER, or Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery.

The latest MDOT analysis focuses not just on the Ford Road/I-275 interchange. Rather, it involves a traffic and environmental study of a larger area bounded by Warren to the north, Cherry Hill to the south. Sheldon to the west and Lotz to the east.

Voices heard

Aside from compiling traffic and accident data in the target area, Yung, other MDOT officials and a consulting firm, Wilbur Smith

Associates, came to Canton's Summit on the Park grand ballroom Thursday evening for an informal meeting to hear the opinions of local residents who struggle every day amid the traffic bottlenecks.

"They drive it every day," Yung said.

Much attention has been given to a yearsold study to reshape the Ford/I-275 interchange. It involves adding new ramps from the southbound I-275 exit to allow motorists to access Haggerty Road in either direction without getting onto Ford. It also calls for a northbound service drive just east of the interstate, from Cherry Hill to north of Ford.

The latest analysis also seeks other options.

"MDOT realizes there's a problem here," said Matt Wendling, a senior civil engineer for Wilbur Smith Associates. "Everything's on the table."

He said the effort involves MDOT, Canton,

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Westland, Wayne County and the Federal Highway Administration — though any traffic solutions could have a far-reaching impact on western Wayne County.

Canton resident Wendy Lukianoff, who lives near Palmer and Sheldon, told officials she opposes a northbound service drive from Cherry Hill, saying it will cause traffic congestion and noise along Cherry Hill, even if it is widened.

"It also would hurt the property values," she told the Observer.

Fixing the mess

Lukianoff said MDOT should consider measures such as installing roundabouts on Ford Road and adding double turn lanes from Ford onto Haggerty.

Canton resident Larry Lucas, who lives near Cherry Hill and Lilley, came to Thursday's meeting to hear what MDOT had to say. He said traffic problems arose as Canton grew faster than its infrastructure did.

"I want to find out when they're going to fix this mess," he said. "We all know we're way behind on what is needed "

Chamber of Commerce President Thomas Paden attended the informal gathering because any traffic projects will affect the local business community. He supports efforts to ease congestion along Ford Road, Canton's main commercial corridor.

"We want to make it as easy as possible to connect the businesses to the consumers." Paden said.

Township Supervisor Phil LaJoy said efforts to address traffic woes, particularly along Ford Road, have been needed for a decade or longer.

"This thing now is on the radar (for MDOT)," he said. "Work is going to be done. I hope it's sooner than later."

Wendling indicated other local meetings are expected in August, September and November as MDOT and Wilbur Smith Associates narrow the list of possible solutions before a final report is finished, likely by early next year.

Even though MDOT can't say with certainty when any road improvements would start, Canton Municipal Services Director Tim Faas said the latest developments, such as the traffic and environmental study, are encouraging.

"This sets the stage, whether we get the (federal) TIGER grant or not," he said.
